

The mission trip to El Salvador was very enlightening, uplifting and productive. There were 14 of us who spent this week building homes of the local village, spending time at the local community center with the children, playing UNO, putting together puzzles and coloring(inside and outline the lines) The wind-chill for the week was about 72° F. There was no air conditioning and no hot water. Believe it or not, the trip was most enjoyable. We visited the Cathedral at San Salvador, visited the grave of Archbishop Oscar Romero and saw where he lived prior to his death in March of 1980. We also visited the Rose Garden dedicated to the Jesuits who were killed in 1989 during the 12 year civil war. Each time I visit El Salvador, I am amazed at the resilience of the people who have very little, the gratitude they have for us when we visit and the brightness of the colors in the flowers, the clothes and the music that the people of

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
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
