Mom: I know you will, Joe, but it's only for a couple of hours. How's your apple juice?


Child: OK. Mom, I think it would be OK if I stayed home today.

# Pastor's Letter to the People of St. Ignatius

Joyful Easter to all of you! No doubt all of you will give a greeting something like that to others today. Every year I ask people at Easter Mass what in their lives they would like to have raised up by the power of the Risen Christ? That's because the Resurrection is for situations in our lives now, and not just for after we are deceased. Everything is raised up, not just our bodies. St Ignatius Parish and School community is going through a dying and rising time, and so are all of us priests who do not know what our next assignment is going to be. We only know that things are going to be different and something new in the Risen Christ is going to come forth. Even if we get what we have asked for from the Archdiocese, and the archbishop announces at the end of Easter time on Pentecost Sunday May 28th, that Saint Ignatius remains an independent parish--sharing a priest with our neighbors—there will still be some dying to self that our parish will experience and a surprising resurrecting of the parish. You see, when God raises people up, He is in charge of what that Resurrection looks like. We can imagine what a newly alive St Ignatius would be, but God decides. I've always known that God is in charge of the cross that I receive. "My yoke is easy, my burden is light," Jesus said, when He promised that He is in charge of the cross, the burden that we receive. That is always a comfort to me, as I know the cross that He will give me is lighter than the one I would design for myself. But this Easter, I'm reflecting on the additional truth: that the Resurrection that He gives me is also different than the one I would design for myself, and much better. So, what is that better Easter that God has in mind for you as a Church community, and for each of you individually?

# Dear Padre,

# Why should I believe Jesus founded the Catholic Church?

What a great question, especially during our Easter season, when the readings at Mass are about how the early Church discovers its mission and identity. Jesus intended to found a Church to carry on his mission.

Jesus chose twelve men to accompany him and learn from him. He passed on his mission to them: "Whoever listens to you listens to me. Whoever rejects you rejects me. And whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me" (Luke 10:16). Jesus called Simon Bar-Jonah "Peter," meaning "rock." Indicating his foundational role, Jesus said to Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind

on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:19).

Throughout the New Testament, we read how the apostles in their turn passed on their authority to other individuals by the laying on of hands (Acts 6:6; 13:3; 1 Timothy 4:14; 2 Timothy 1:6). Initially, the only two orders were bishops and deacons, but soon priests were also ordained to share some of the authority of the bishop and to be his assistants.

The Church would exist and do Jesus' work until the end of time. The whole Church, the "Body of Christ," as Paul would call it (1 Corinthians 12:27), would be Christ acting in the world on his behalf. The Church and all its members are to be "the light of the world" and "the salt of the earth" (Matthew 5:13-16).
