

Pastor's letter to the People of St. Ignatius

"Happy Advent!"

Who says that? It is not in our usual expression like "Happy Thanksgiving!" Well, if we try on "Happy Advent," and mean it, we will feel the joy of Christmas. Another way, beyond a sincere greeting, to prepare for Christmas, is to reach out to people who are outside your usual circle, outside your comfort zone. How about responding to the Archbishop's invitation to work on racial unity in our Diocese by visiting an ethnically different Parish at a Sunday Mass during Advent. I had previously suggested Saint Elizabeth, and then heard from their Pastor that they already have several other mostly white parishes who are sending people to visit them. However, I heard from Father Tim Cook, Pastor of Saint Teresa and Bridget on North Grand, about a half a mile north of the Fox Theater, that they do not have so many parishes sending visitors. Some of our people have already responded to this invitation and told me they are willing to go. If you are too, let me know, and we will arrange a group who will go together. Just let Father Tim know who you are and where you are from. Give yourself this early Christmas gift. I am sure you will enjoy their warm welcome, and the African American cultural style of Sunday Mass. I know they will feel the warmth from St. Ignatius people visiting them! Happy Advent!


I noticed in our Sunday bulletin that our parish is setting up a Jesse tree and a giving tree for Advent. What are these trees?

narishes and families use the Jesse tree and the giving tree as two distinct ways to prepare for the coming of Jesus, the child king.

We use the Jesse tree to remember Jesus' own royal family tree. The Gospel of Matthew traces Jesus' genealogy back to Abraham (1:1-17), while Luke lists his ancestors back to Adam (3:23–28). The purpose is to connect Jesus to Abraham and Adam, and convey the historical longing of the Chosen People

for a messiah. Throughout Advent, names of significant figures in Israelite history and quotations from the Hebrew Testament are hung on the branches. Usually, the Jesse tree is placed in a prominent position, in church or at home, so all can see the history of Iesus unfold as we get ever closer to Christmas.

The giving tree challenges each parish family or member to buy a gift for someone in



need. The parish sets up a tree that is decorated with tags suggesting gifts for those in need. Clothing sizes and children's ages are connected with the requests on the tree, so that the givers can easily get the needed items and take their gifts to the church by a designated date. The gifts are then distributed before Christmas. The giving tree unites us to the great message Iesus continues to give us at Christmas: Whatever you do to the least of these, you do to me (see Matthew 25:40).
