Often there have been times when I was asked to go where I didn't want to go, like Peter being asked to get out of the boat. Ultimately I realized that those were also the very times when I seemed most aware of God's presence. Oh, I think God

was always there, it's simply that my own ego often got in the way. It was when I gave in that I most felt buoyed by God. In fact, the least satisfying assignment was the one I eagerly sought out, and some of those I resisted

turned out to be graced. Like Peter, it's good to do what doesn't always make sense.

What does all this have to do with my choice of this Scripture reading for my funeral? Well, every

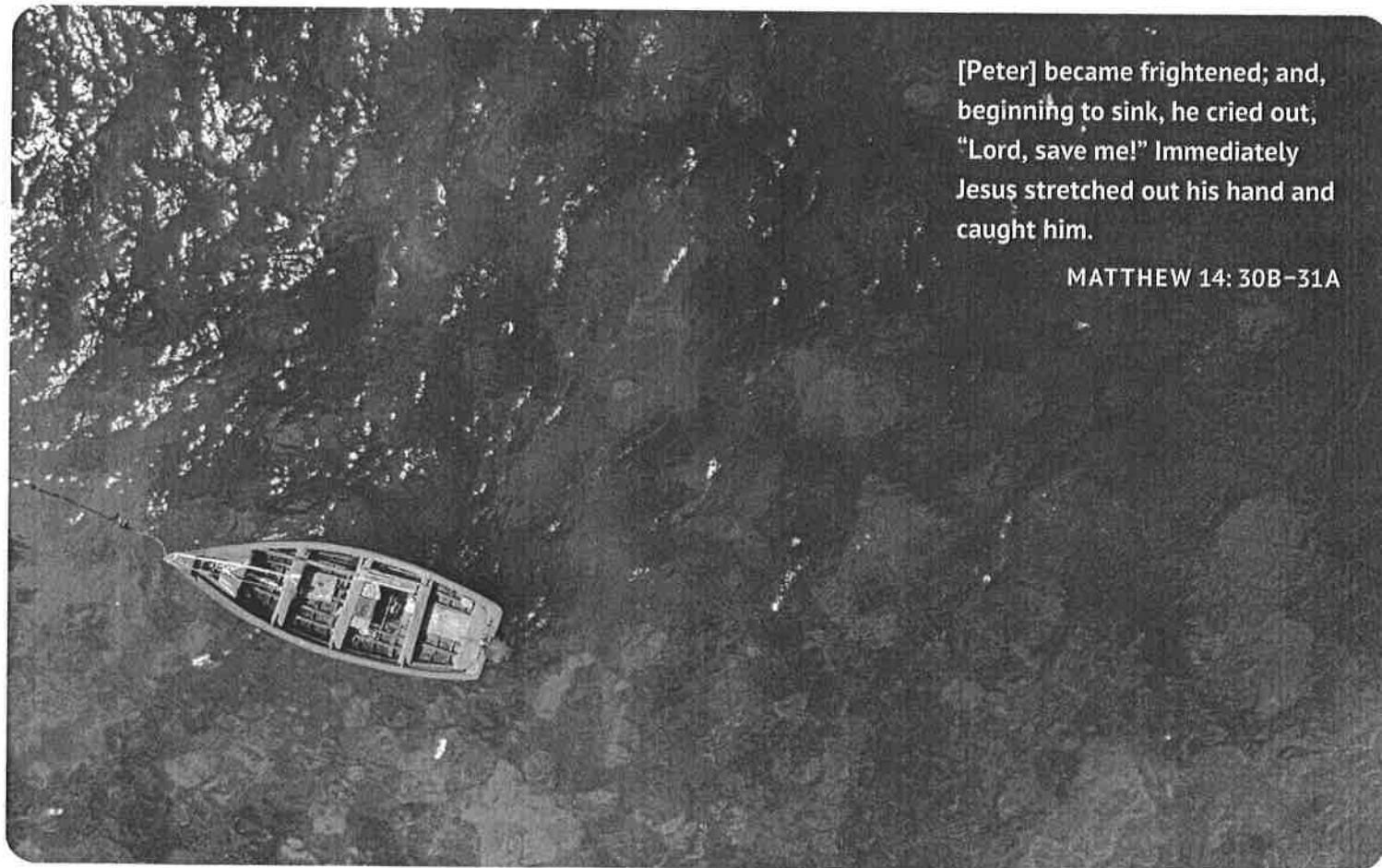
time I have stepped out of the boat of security, God has been there to sustain me. I figure there is going to be no bigger "stepping out" than death, so I'm expecting God will be there as well. ●

Pastor's Letter to the People of St. Ignatius

While there is still time for ice cream and a few more days at the pool, the mid-point of August means that summer is quickly coming to an end. It's back to school time and the new school year begins this week for our parish school. Let's pray that it is a good year for our students and faculty. When I think of August what stands out for me are the feast days in honor of our Blessed Mother. On August 15th, we will celebrate the Assumption of Mary into heaven, a solemnity, and Holy Day of obligation in the Church. It was fitting that God should bring Mary into heaven, body, and soul, because she is the mother of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Therefore, Mary is the mother of God. God also saw fit to honor Mary in this way, because she is without sin, and because of the superabundance of merit she earned during her earthly life. Although the Assumption was a singular privilege for the Blessed Virgin, it is also a sign of hope for us, because at the resurrection of the dead on the last day, our souls will be reunited with our bodies, and we will join Mary and all the saints in praising God forever in heaven. A week later, on August 22nd, we will celebrate the coronation of Mary, Queen of heaven and earth. From her place in heaven, Mary continues to watch over God's children. With a mother's love, she intercedes for us with her Son, Jesus Christ, especially when we are most in need. These celebrations in honor of Mary give us the opportunity to foster our admiration and love for the Blessed Mother. The Church has a rich treasury of devotions in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Chief among these is the Holy Rosary. The rosary is a beautiful prayer where the individual meditates on the saving mysteries in the life of Jesus and the faithful witness of Mary. Many saints and popes have encouraged us to pray the Rosary regularly, even daily, if possible. Praying the rosary is a path to holiness, because as we reflect on the various mysteries, we are encouraged to follow the example of Jesus and Mary. Those who pray the rosary consistently find greater strength in fighting temptations and sin. Praying the rosary as a family is a sure way to foster peace and harmony. As a loving mother, Mary wants to give us her help and protection. But most importantly, Mary will always lead us closer to her Son, Jesus.

1st Leg: *St. Ignatius, Concord Hill to St. Paul's UCC, Marthasville 6.0 Miles

10:15 a.m. - 10:55 a.m.

Starting at St. Ignatius church, turn left on Mill Rd. to Concord Hill Rd. At Hwy 94 turn left onto east bound Hwy 94, continue to Hwy 47. At Hwy 47, turn left onto north bound Hwy 47 to Pecan St. in Marthasville. Turn right on Pecan St. and continue onto west South St. Cross 1st St. and continue on east South St. Turn left on South 3rd St., 1 block past St. Paul's UCC, then right on 4th St. behind city hall.

2nd Leg: *St. Paul's UCC, Marthasville to St. Vincent de Paul, Dutzow 5.3 Miles

10:55 a.m. - 11:35 a.m.

From South 4th St., turn right on Hwy D (east Main St.). Continue to Boone Monument Rd. and turn right. Take Boone Monument Rd. to Loop Rd. and Bluff Rd. along the bottoms to Hwy 94 in Dutzow. Turn left onto east bound Hwy 94 and continue to St. Vincent's church. Turn right into the first entrance at St. Vincent's by the cemetery. Pull into the lower parking area by the cafeteria. 40 minute lunch and restroom break.

3rd Leg: *St. Vincent de Paul, Dutzow to Immaculate Conception, Augusta 5.2 Miles

12:15 p.m. - 12:45 p.m.

From St. Vincent's turn right onto east Hwy 94 and continue to Immaculate Conception church. Exit into church parking lot. Regroup and allow traffic to pass before proceeding.

4th Leg: *Immaculate Conception, Augusta to City of Augusta 1.1 Miles

12:50 p.m. - 1:00 p.m.

From Immaculate Conception turn right onto east bound Hwy 94, continue to Church St. in Augusta and turn right.

5th Leg: City of Augusta to City of Washington 8.8 Miles

1:00 p.m. - 1:55 p.m.

Continue on Church St. and turn right on Hackmann Rd./Lower St. Turn right on Walnut St., then left on Jackson St. Turn right on High St./Augusta Bottom Rd. Continue on Augusta Bottom Rd. to Hwy 47. Turn left onto south bound Hwy 47, cross the bridge and turn right on 3rd St. in Washington, then turn left into the Mercy Doctor's Building parking lot. Await the arrival of the southern route tractors coming along 5th St. and follow them to the Knights of Columbus hall.

Total Distance from St. Ignatius to Mercy Doctor's Building 26.4 Miles

*The main food and donation collection points will be at St. Ignatius, St. Paul's UCC, St. Vincent de Paul and Immaculate Conception. Donations will also be accepted anywhere along the route.

Dear Padre,

At what precise point in the Mass does the bread and wine turn into the Body and Blood of Christ?

For many centuries, thinkers in the Western and Eastern Churches have pondered this question. Some say the moment of consecration happens at the beginning of the sentence, "This is my body." Others say it happens at the conclusion of that sentence. Still others claim it happens sometime during the sentence. The same theories were proposed about the consecration of the cup. From the Eastern Churches, the theory was raised that it wasn't the eucharistic narrative that was consecratory, but rather the prayer of invocation to the Holy Spirit known as the *epiclesis*.

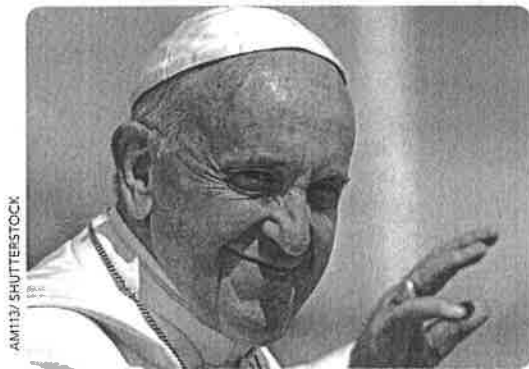
These theories continue to be debated, but to what avail? Even the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* does not specify when the consecration happens (CCC 1375–81). But knowing the precise moment it happens doesn't seem to be as important as simply knowing that the elements of bread and wine over which the prayer is prayed do become for us the Body and Blood of Christ.

This mystery of faith, moreover, adds another dimension to our lives: transformation into Christ. Whether we share in Communion at the liturgy or contemplate the Lord in the tabernacle, the loving call of the Spirit is to change our hearts. Specifically, when does that happen to us? One never knows for sure. But by participation in the mystery of faith, we're changed ever more deeply into the One whose Body and Blood we share. ●
