

Renewal by the Holy Spirit

We have all received baptism, but why don't the amazing fruits and graces received then always show themselves powerfully in our lives?

Titus tells us what has already happened for us in baptism. We were saved "through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the holy Spirit" (3:5). Yet this renewal accomplished by the Spirit needs to be fully embraced by us for it to reach its potential. We know we have been renewed, but how do we keep renewing? This happens by prayerful contact with the Holy Spirit.

In Titus, Spirit is capitalized because it's the Spirit of God. Renewal by the Holy Spirit is a renewal in which God, not man, is the principal protagonist. "Behold, I" (not you) "make all things new" (Revelation 21:5).

We often think that to be renewed and grow, we have to do something. God tells us it is something he does. "I, the LORD, make you holy" (Leviticus 20:8). We have to give him back the power he already has. Or better yet, we need to recognize God's power and let him use it in us.

A revolution needs to happen in our minds and hearts where we recognize that without the Holy Spirit we can do nothing. So ask the Holy Spirit to come upon you in a real baptism of fire. Then all those baptismal gifts will spark into a flame and help you set the world ablaze with his love!

Pastor's letter to the People of St. Ignatius

I take the bright warmth of Christmas time to heart as I step into a challenging labor of decision-making with all of you about the future of our parish school. The Town Hall is this Wednesday at 7 p.m. in our Community Center. Staff members of the Diocesan Office of Catholic Education and Formation have told the six Pastors of the local Catholic schools that have suffered a long trend of falling enrollment, many options by which the schools could share personnel and resources to save money, keep some amount of Catholic Education going, and be able to afford valuable enhancements of the children's education. The Pastors paired down all those options to two, and after one recent Steering Committee meeting, that became three. We will hear those three options at the Town Hall. Everyone will be invited to write questions on response cards, and the Diocesan staff may respond to some of those questions. Then after the Diocesan staff leaves, the Principal and our Steering Committee Rep's and I will remain for some additional conversation if anybody wants to say anything further that night. We will do a quick polling of the room and see if any of the parents want to come back the following Wednesday night the 23rd for some additional discussion. We will give out written response forms for next year's school parents to take home, to write which of the three options for the school they will commit to for next year. Those are due back to the school office or the rectory by Friday January 25th. I will use those responses of the parents and the input from the Principal and Faculty as the foundation for my decision. Please pray for the Spirit to be with all of us who love Saint Ignatius School. Blessings! Father Steve

Dear Padre,

My fiancée was baptized in the Lutheran Church. If she becomes Catholic, will she be baptized again?

A person can be validly baptized only once, whether in or out of the Catholic Church. Catholics believe three things are necessary for a valid baptism: first, baptizing in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; second, flowing water; and third, the intention of the “minister” to baptize using the form (words of the Trinitarian formula) and matter (flowing water) needed for a valid baptism.

Orthodox and most Protestant baptisms are recognized by the Catholic Church. However, baptisms performed by

Christian communities that don't believe in the Trinity—Jehovah's Witnesses and Mormons, for example—are not recognized by the Catholic Church as valid. These communities may use the same matter (flowing water), but they don't have the same form (Trinitarian formula) or intention in their baptism.

If your fiancée decides to become Catholic, she will need to attend Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) classes, make her first Communion and reconciliation, and be confirmed, but she has already been validly baptized and will not need to be baptized again.
